[Beverly Hills Has Nation's Priciest Housing](#)

For the second straight year, Beverly Hills finished first among U.S. cities in [Coldwell Banker's 2007 Home Price Comparison Index](#) (HPCI). The study found that a typical four-bedroom, 2.5-bath, 2,200-square-foot home would cost \$2.2 million in BevHills.

At the opposite end is Killeen, Texas, where the same home would fetch around \$136,000. As [we noted in a previous post](#), Texas is one state where houses are actually appreciating.

If you're ready to ditch this crazy U.S. real-estate roller coaster, the most affordable international market was Bogata, Colombia, where the typical home would run you around \$140,000. But your money wouldn't go far in Dublin, Ireland, where the subject home would fetch more than \$2 million.
